In a world where we continually feel disconnected, we invite you to come and connect. Bound by no common language and knowing no limits, three individually choreographed pieces collide in a moment of theatrical physicality not to be missed.

PROGRAMME

1. 'SUPERRALEIDER'

Choreographer: Tom Dale

Assistant Choreographer: Jemima Brown

We were interested in creating the appearance of organic systems and structures that would have been too complicated for us to create by individually directing all of the dancers. Instead, we looked at creating and working with creative systems that enabled the dancers to build their own complex relationships, with the hope that these abstract structures allowed their movement to flourish over time. The music of Nils Frahm inspired this interweaving and layering in the work and our commitment to structured complexity.

2. 'THE DARK SIDE'

Choreographer: Giuseppe Casiero

Inspired by Laurie Anderson and Kronos Quartet's "Landfall", 'The Dark Side' recalls Anderson's experience of Hurricane Sandy. Landfall juxtaposes lush electronics and traditional strings by Kronos with Anderson's powerful descriptions of loss, and in this choreography, we explore how human memory can be stronger than catastrophe. The idea of how we handle loss, how we search for meaning in the mystery of it all.

A celebration of the iconic choreography of Bob Fosse. The sass and attitude of brass orchestrations inspire the explosive, theatrical movement as themes of empowerment, status, mystery, and wit are woven through a lively, unapologetic journey of American Jazz dance.

I am continually fascinated and challenged by the daily exploration of performing arts within the intersectional, multicultural and beautiful environment that is SPAA, and how our respective art forms interact to communicate our stories, and articulate our human experience. CHOREOGRAPHERS

ALEX JESSO

Alex trained at Laine Theatre Arts, graduating with the Trinity Level 6 National Diploma in Musical Theatre, BA (Hons) in Musical Theatre and ISTD Modern teaching qualifications. Upon graduating, Alex performed in 'Chicago' (Swing and understudy 'Amos', Adelphi Theatre London), 'We Will Rock You' (1st understudy 'Galileo', Dominion Theatre London), 'Saturday Night Fever' ('Bobby C' and alternate 'Tony Manero', UK Tour and Apollo Victoria Theatre London), and more. He was resident choreographer and Jazz teacher for the prestigious Laine Theatre. Alex also recently represented ArtsEd in Dubai as part of their international outreach programme, bringing the West End to the Middle East.

GIUSEPPE CASIERO

Giuseppe Casiero was born in Andria (Italy) in 1992 and at the age of 16 he moved to Florence where he attended the Professional Dance Training at the School of Balletto Di Toscana and danced in the same Company. In 2014 he joined as soloist dancer the Nordharzer Stadtebund Theater in Germany. In the same year he made his debut as a choreographer creating the piece SÄRMÄ for the Company. In 2017 he founded the Amniotik Ballet Company. From 2019 till today he took part in various international productions including: Show: Leila, the Land of Imagination at "King Khalid International Stadium" in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia , Show: Golden Jubilee for EXPO 2020, Dubai (Prod: David Atkins Ent), Closing Ceremony for EXPO 2020 with Christina Aguilera - Art Dir. Daniel Ezralow (Dubai) and Opening Ceremony for the IFMA WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP in Abu Dhabi.

TOM DALE

Tom is a choreographer, dance artist and Artistic Director for Tom Dale Company which he founded in 2010. Here he brings together teams of creatives to explore creative dance and digital art creating contemporary performance work across a wide variety of settings. As a choreographer Tom is as much interested in the empirical knowledge built up by the moving body through movement practices as he is in the crafting and weaving of art forms with new technologies. Tom has created all of TDC's work to date including critically acclaimed pieces Rise, I Infinite, Refugees of the Septic Heart, Step Sonic and Digitopia, which won the award for Outstanding Production at the UK's Theatre and Technology Awards 2017.

JEMIMA BROWN (ASSISTANT CHOREOGRAPHER)

Jemima Brown is a Dance Artist and singer/songwriter originally from Belfast, Northern Ireland. Since Graduating in 2015, Jemima has been touring and performing in work nationally and internationally with companies such as Tom Dale Company, Shobana Jeyasingh Dance, James Cousins Company and Avant Garde Dance Company. Notably she has been twice nominated for a National Dance Award for her work with Tom Dale Company and James Cousins Company for 'Outstanding Female Modern Performance' and 'The Emerging Artist Award'. As a keen musician, singer/songwriter alongside her dance career, Jemima has released her own EP 'Alter Ego' and various music videos under the artist name MYMA.

LISA ROWLEY (REHEARSAL DIRECTOR)

Lisa trained at Trinity Laban in London, and gained a BA HONS in Dance Theatre. She then went on to do her MA with Transitions Dance Company, touring internationally. She then went onto to work with Henri Oguike Dance Company, Ace Dance and Music, Annabelle Lopez Ochoa, Bawren Tavaziva, Douglas Thorpe and Joss Arnott Dance, whom she continued to work with for nine years. Lisa was Head of contemporary at the prestigious Italia Conti School in London where she was able to choreograph for MOVE IT Exhibition. She then continued her journey in teaching and choreography in the UAE where she is currently Lead Tutor of Dance at Sharjah Performing Arts Academy.
